


It was really interesting and is a good basis to use Yocto in industrial project.

Great training to handle quite a complex topic!








remote labs not as usefull as on site, but do quite the job




Really good knowledge of the subject, answer all questions. Really good!


Some theorical lectures with no direct usage, like tools, but it's important to know they exist, so...
