

generally speaking topics in embedded can be tough because many knowledge dependencies are needed and its hard to come up with a learning path that makes sense but bootlin seems to do that well.





they were useful. they could maybe be ran in a slower pace, if possible.



The agenda was quite tight and in the last session we were running against time to finish whitin the period. I mean, if we had had more doubts during classes, it would have been hard to finish the course in time.




