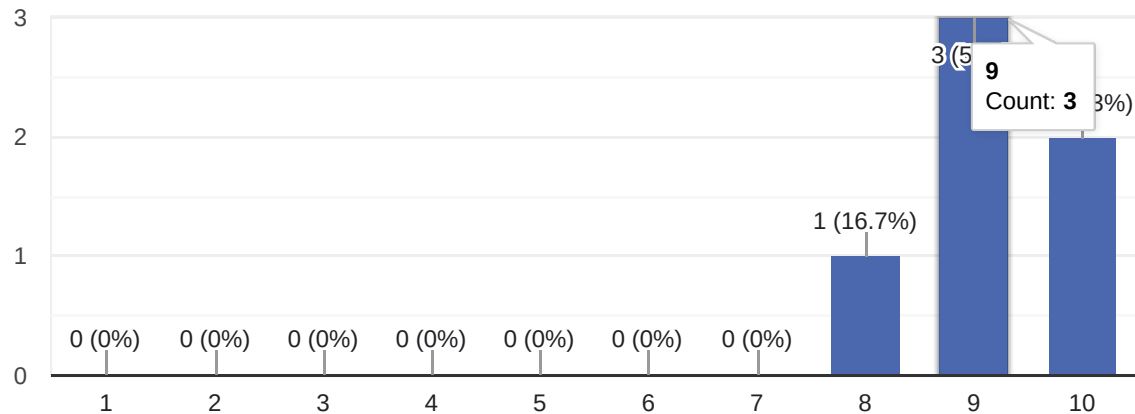

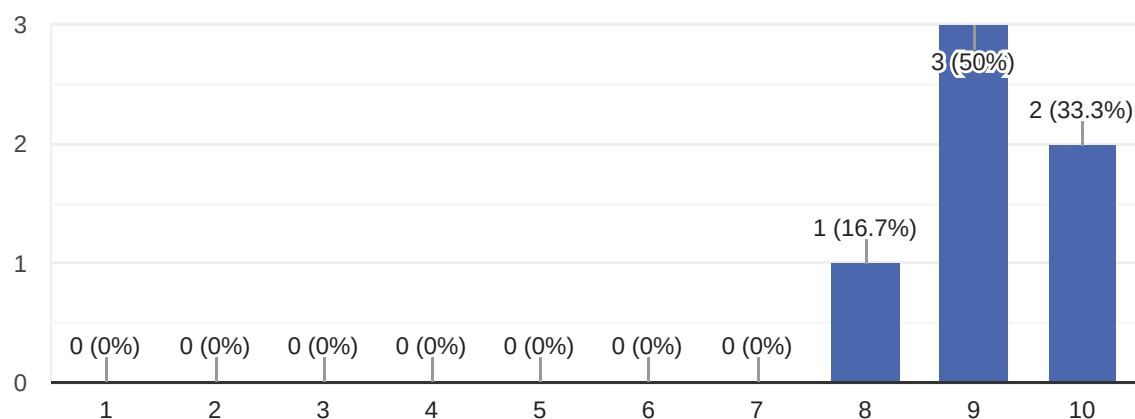

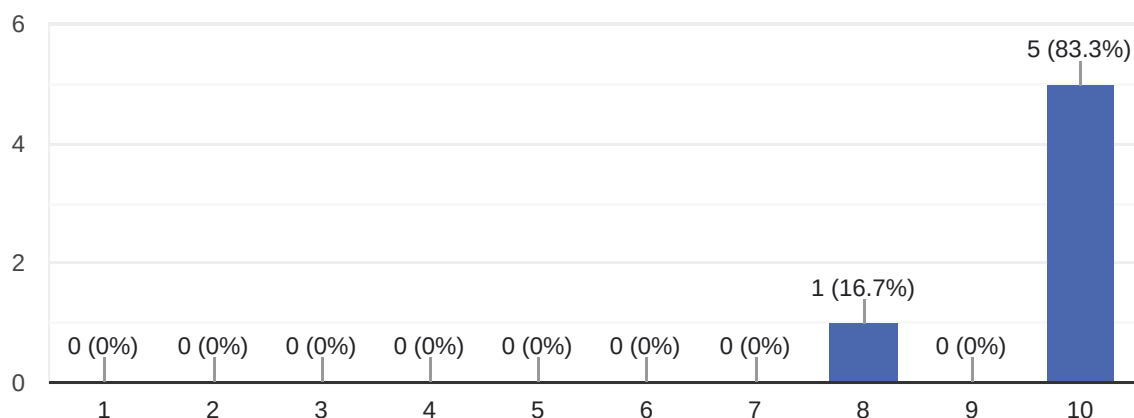
For my current role, this course will bring a fresh view and maybe new ideas can be implemented in the future making use of these instruments.

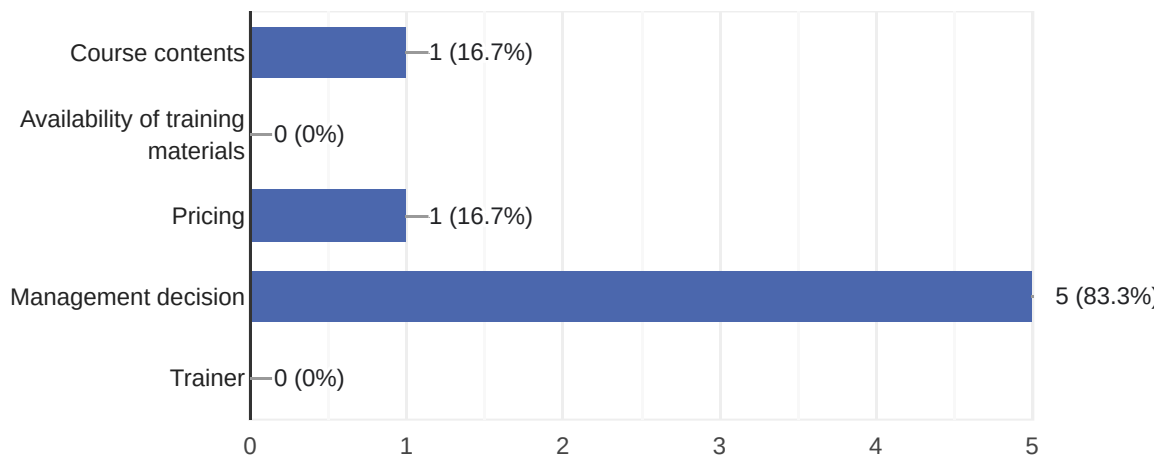
I thought that that the theory part felt too dense. Too much information in a short amount of time. Perhaps more time could be dedicated to the labs.
