

Excellent course but I think there is too much material, therefore I suggest to split the course in two.


For the (entry) quiz, make answers optional instead of mandatory.





I didn't notice that the first session was starting 15 minutes earlier than others when looking at the training material.


Maybe it's just my fault, maybe it should be more visible ? Or align the start time across all sessions ?




