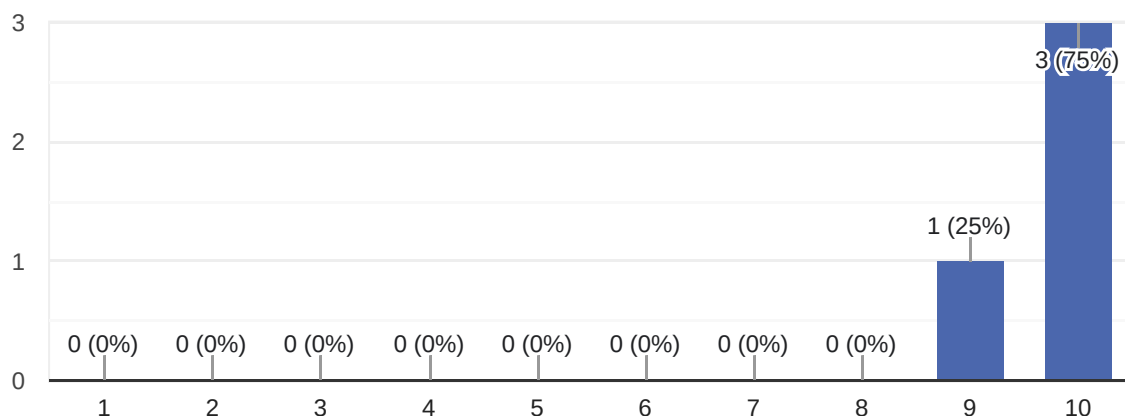

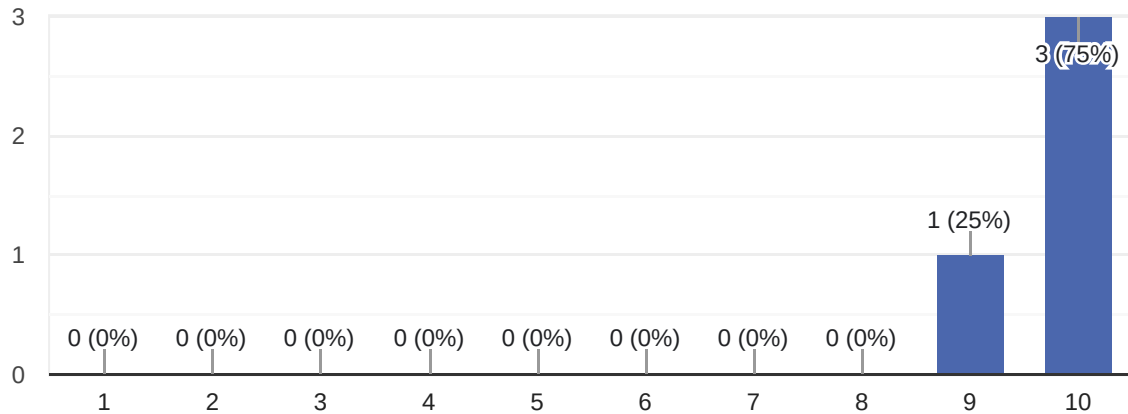

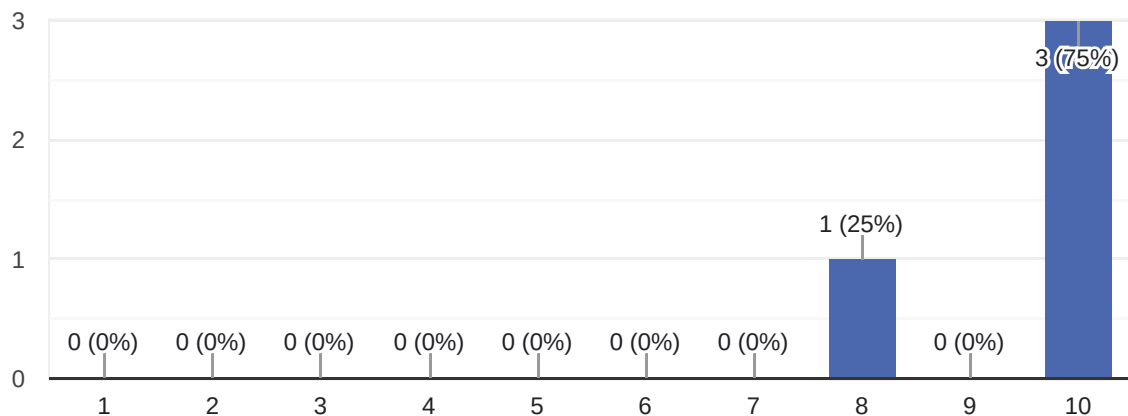
Very useful, ran into a lot of issue but this was good as I got a lot of practical knowledge and common hangups.

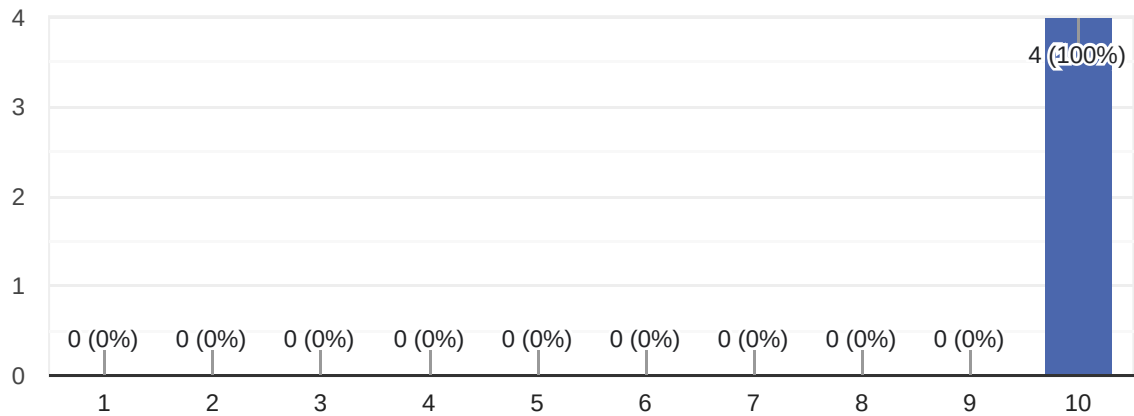

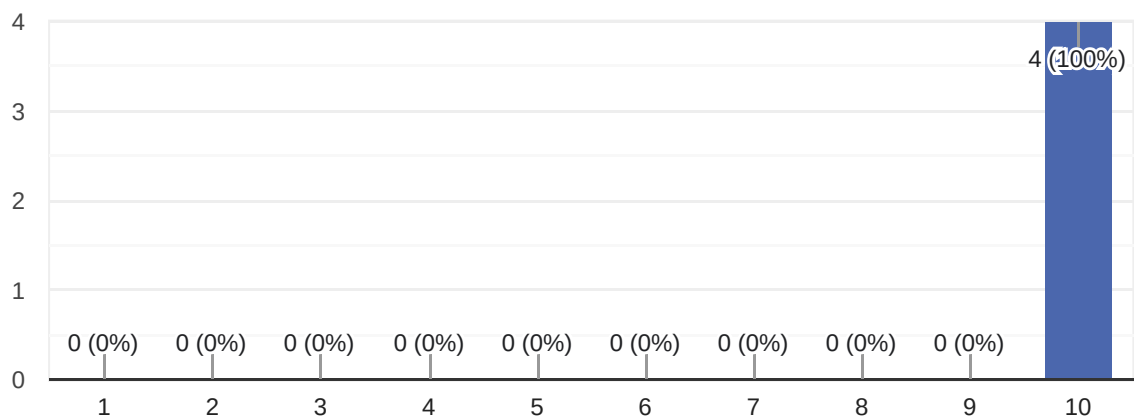

What part(s) of the course did you like least?

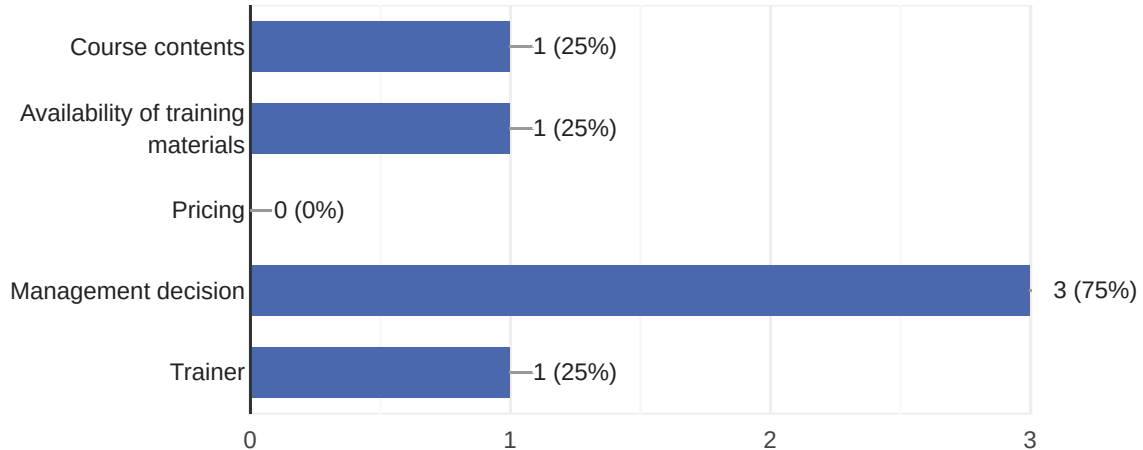
